Hon. Dr. Makali Mulu, CBS has served as the Member of Parliament for Kitui Central Constituency in the National Assembly of Kenya since 2013.

He is an economist with professional experience in public finance, economic policy, governance, strategic planning, budgeting, monitoring and evaluation, statistics, and project management.

During his parliamentary service, he has participated in legislative, oversight, and budget-making processes in the National Assembly, with particular focus on public financial management, government expenditure, and development planning.

He has served in several parliamentary committees, including the Budget and Appropriations Committee, the House Business Committee, the Administration and National Security Committee, the Finance and National Planning Committee, the Selection Committee, and the Public Debt Committee, where he served as Vice-Chairperson. He currently serves as a member of the Budget and Appropriations Committee and the Regional Integration Committee.

Hon. Dr. Makali Mulu has also represented Kenya in the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association (CPA), serving as a CPA Branch Representative and as a member of the Programme and Finance Sub-Committee of the CPA Africa Executive Committee. He also served as the senior CPA Regional Representative

for East Africa, where he sat on the CPA International Executive Committee.

Before joining Parliament, he worked in public service and development programmes in the areas of budgeting, monitoring and evaluation, governance, statistics, and project management. His professional experience includes consultancy assignments for government institutions, United Nations agencies, and the World Bank.

He previously served as an Independent Consultant in monitoring and evaluation and programme management, and as a Monitoring and Evaluation Specialist under the Governance, Justice, Law and Order Sector (GJLOS) Reform Programme. Earlier in his career, he worked at the Community Development Trust Fund (CDTF) and the Ministry of Finance and Planning.

Hon. Dr. Makali Mulu holds a Bachelor of Arts (First Class Honours) in Economics from the University of Nairobi, a Master of Arts in Economics from the University of Nairobi, and a Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) in Economics from Kenyatta University.

Construction of modern school classrooms, laboratories expand access to quality education in Kitui Central

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Education infrastructure has remained one of the defining pillars of development in Kitui Central Constituency since 2013.

Since his election as Member of Parliament in 2013, Hon. Dr. Makali Mulu has consistently invested in creating modern, safe and conducive learning environments through the construction, renovation and expansion of educational facilities across all five wards of the constituency.

His constituency's development record from 2013 to 2026 demonstrates sustained investment in classrooms, science laboratories, dormitories, lecture halls, school kitchens and dining halls, sanitation facilities and other learning infrastructure.

Rather than concentrating projects within a few institutions, Hon. Makali spread the projects across primary schools, secondary schools and tertiary institutions, ensuring that learners in different parts of Kitui Central benefited from improved educational facilities.

Modern Science laboratories (2013 - 2022)

One of the earliest priorities was strengthening science education through construction of modern laboratories in secondary schools.

Between 2013 and 2022, laboratories were completed in

Classroom renovation (2013 – 2022)

While new construction remained important, Hon. Dr. Makali Mulu directed a significant proportion of constituency resources towards rehabilitating existing classrooms.

Between 2013 and 2022, schools across Kitui Central underwent phased renovation programmes designed to improve learning environments by replacing worn-out structures, repairing roofs, floors, windows and walls, and modernising classrooms.

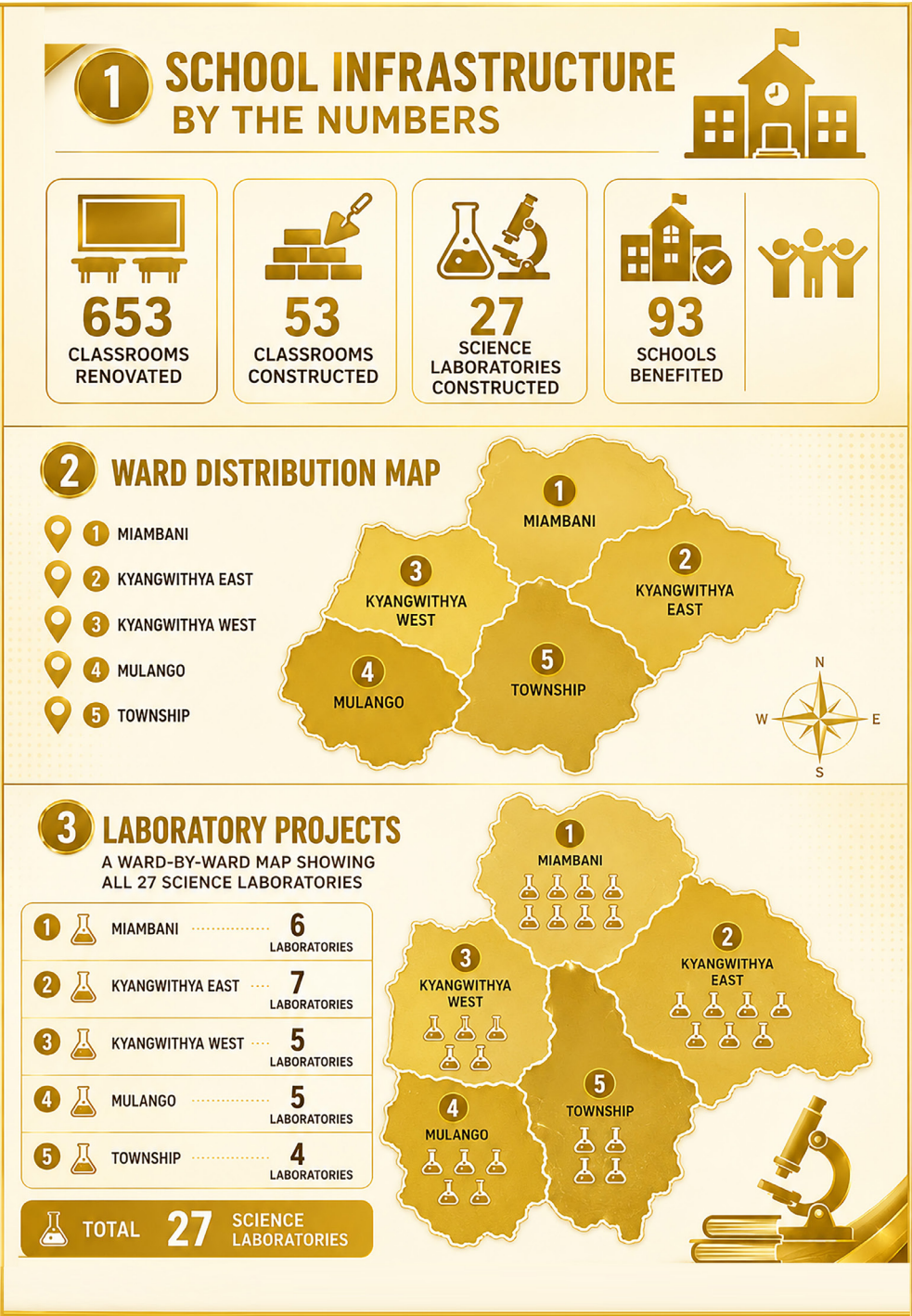

Dormitories, kitchens, dining halls, lecture halls, toilets: Makali's efforts to strengthen School welfare yield results

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Beyond classrooms and laboratories, quality education depends on supporting infrastructure that enables learners to study in a safe, healthy and conducive environment.

Boarding facilities, sanitation, dining halls, kitchens and tertiary learning infrastructure all play an important role in improving educational outcomes.

Since 2013, Hon. Dr. Makali Mulu's development agenda expanded beyond classroom construction to strengthen the wider learning environment across Kitui Central Constituency.

His development record shows sustained investment in dormitories, sanitation facilities, dining halls, kitchens, lecture halls and administration buildings, ensuring schools and training institutions developed into more complete centres of learning.

Implemented across successive financial years, these projects complemented investments in classrooms and science laboratories by addressing

welfare, hygiene, nutrition and institutional capacity.

Dormitory construction (2013 - 2022)

As enrolment increased in boarding schools across Kitui Central, accommodation emerged as an important priority.

Between 2013 and 2022, Hon. Dr. Makali Mulu constructed dormitories in several institutions to improve boarding capacity and provide learners with safer and more conducive accommodation.

The projects included dormitories at:

- Mutulukuni Secondary School
- Ithookwe Primary School
- Wii Secondary School
- Unyaa Primary School
- Tiva Primary School
- Central Primary School
- Katulani Primary School.

These facilities reduced congestion within existing boarding sections while enabling schools to admit more learners from distant parts of the constituency.

For many students travelling long distances to school, improved boarding facilities also reduced absenteeism and increased learning time.

Kitchens and dining halls

Education outcomes are influenced not only by classrooms but also by learner welfare.

Recognising this, the constituency, under the leadership of Hon. Dr. Makali Mulu, invested in construction of kitchens and dining halls to improve food preparation and dining facilities within boarding schools.

Completed projects included:

- Kitchen and dining hall at Kwa Muema Secondary School.

- Kitchen and dining hall at Kyamathyaka Secondary School.

These facilities provided schools with dedicated spaces for meal preparation and dining, replacing temporary arrangements that often constrained boarding programmes.

Modern kitchens also improve hygiene standards while enabling institutions to serve increasing student populations more efficiently.

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Supporting inclusive learning at Kitui School for the Deaf

Hon. Makali extended his support to special needs education where Kitui School for the Deaf benefited from construction of a modern kitchen and dining hall.

The facility strengthened boarding services by improving food preparation, storage and dining space for learners with hearing disabilities.

This project complements earlier improvements undertaken at Kitui School for the Mentally Handicapped, demonstrating continued support for inclusive education within the constituency.

Expanding capacity at Kenya Medical Training College

Hon. Dr. Makali Mulu also invested in tertiary education infrastructure.

To strengthen healthcare training, he constructed two lecture halls at the Kenya Medical Training College (KMTC), Kitui Campus.

The projects increased teaching space while improving the institution’s capacity to accommodate growing student enrolment.

Expansion of KMTC infrastructure contributes to the training of future healthcare professionals who support Kenya’s health sector.

By investing in medical education infrastructure, he helped strengthen human resource development beyond primary and secondary education.

Strengthening educational administration

Modern educational institutions require administrative infrastructure capable of supporting efficient management.

During the reporting period, Hon. Makali also expanded administration facilities, including development works at St. Angela’s Girls Secondary School.

Effective public service delivery depends on accessible government infrastructure.

Administrative offices, police facilities and other public buildings provide the physical foundation through which government delivers security, resolves disputes, coordinates development and responds to community needs.

Between 2013 and 2026, Hon. Dr. Makali Mulu's prioritised the expansion of government infrastructure across Kitui Central Constituency.

Through National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) projects and successful engagement with the National Government, Kitui Central constituency witnessed the construction of Chiefs' and Assistant Chiefs' offices, police housing, police post improvements and establishment of new administrative offices.

These investments strengthened the presence of government at the grassroots while improving working conditions for public officers and enhancing access to essential public services.

Offices for Chiefs and Assistant Chiefs (2013–2022)

In his first and second terms as Kitui Central Member of Parliament, Hon. Dr. Makali Mulu embarked on one of his most extensive programmes of administrative infrastructure development in Kitui Central constituency.

He constructed new offices for Chiefs and Assistant Chiefs across all wards in Kitui Central to decentralise government services

- Expansion of government administrative services within Miambani and other parts of the constituency.

Providing modern staff housing improves officer welfare, enhances operational readiness and supports continuous delivery of security services within the constituency.

Upgrading police infrastructure

In addition to new housing, existing security facilities underwent rehabilitation.

Completed projects included:

- Renovation of Mulundi Police Post.
- Fencing of Mulutu Police Post.

These improvements enhanced security installations while extending the lifespan of existing public infrastructure.

Successful lobbying for National Government offices

Beyond projects financed directly through the NG-CDF, Hon. Makali Mulu successfully engaged the National Government to establish additional administrative institutions within Kitui Central constituency.

Among the notable achievements were:

- Establishment of the Kitui Central Deputy County Commissioner's (DCC) Office.
- Establishment of Assistant

These offices strengthened coordination of National Government programmes while reducing the need for residents to travel long distances to access administrative services.

Improving access to public services

Chiefs' and Assistant Chiefs' offices perform critical public functions including:

- Civil registration support.
- Public participation.
- Community dispute resolution.
- Disaster response coordination.
- National Government programme implementation.
- Public awareness campaigns.
- Security coordination.

The expansion of these facilities has therefore improved access to government services while strengthening communication between citizens and public institutions.

Supporting community security

Investment in police infrastructure contributes directly to community safety.

Modern police housing enables officers to remain close to their

duty stations, improving response times during emergencies and strengthening community policing initiatives.

Similarly, improved police posts provide better working environments for officers while supporting effective law enforcement.

These investments create safer communities that encourage business, education and social development.

Complementing National Development

The constituency's administrative infrastructure programme illustrates the value of collaboration between constituency leadership and the National Government.

While the NG-CDF financed construction of several local administrative offices, successful lobbying secured larger institutional investments such as the Deputy County Commissioner's Office and Assistant County Commissioner's offices.

This complementary approach maximised public investment by combining local development initiatives with National Government resources.

Building institutions that serve communities

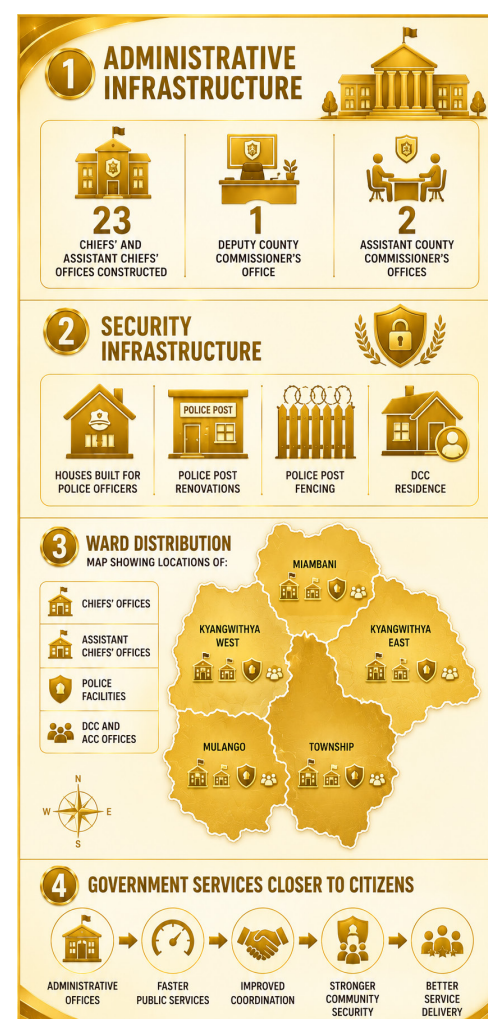
Development extends beyond roads and schools. Strong public institutions are equally important in ensuring citizens receive timely government services.

Between 2013 and 2027, Kitui Central, under its member of parliament Hon. Makali Mulu,

significantly expanded its administrative and security infrastructure through new Chiefs' offices, Assistant Chiefs' offices, police housing and government administrative facilities.

These investments have strengthened public administration, improved security infrastructure and enhanced accessibility of government services across the constituency.

Together, they form an important component of the constituency's broader development programme by creating institutions capable of supporting sustainable growth and effective public service delivery.

Reliable transport infrastructure is essential for economic activity, access to services and community development. Between 2013 and 2026, Hon. Dr. Makali Mulu prioritised the construction, upgrading and improvement of road infrastructure across Kitui Central Constituency, enhancing connectivity between villages, trading centres and public institutions.

Extensive road construction and upgrading

Through sustained lobbying, numerous roads in Kitui Central constituency, received grading, slab construction, culvert installation and widening beyond the routine allocations of the Kenya Rural Roads Authority (KeRRA).

Major projects included:

- Kitui – Museve – Miambani – Mwanyani – Mikuyuni Road – slab construction and grading exceeding **Kshs.100 million.**
- Kalundu – Mutune – Wanzua – Kasyala – Usiani Road – slab construction and grading exceeding **Kshs.100 million.**
- Kitui – Museve – Miambani –

- Kiviu – Kamandio – Kiluma Road – improvements exceeding **Kshs.70 million.**
- Mutula – Mutukya – Kiongwe Road – improvements exceeding **Kshs.30 million.**
- Museve – Katia – Kauluni – Kanzooko Road – improvements exceeding **Kshs.30 million.**
- Kwa Mwongela – Kyalililini – Kitwii – Kwa Mutheke Road – improvements exceeding **Kshs.30 million.**
- Kalawa – Ngenuka Nenda – Mulundi – Mathuluni Road

- grading and culvert works exceeding **Kshs.20 million.**
- Ithiani – Itoleka – Kakuuni – Katulani Road – grading exceeding **Kshs.15 million.**
- Kwa Momo – Kabaa – Kasevi – Kiala Road – improvements exceeding **Kshs.15 million.**
- Kangalu Junction – Maamani – Yakalia – Break Corner – Mbusyani Road – widening and grading valued at approximately **Kshs.5 million.**
- Kwa Ndaa – Kwa Muema – Kavuvoni Road – grading valued at approximately

Kshs.5 million.

These projects improved road accessibility, reduced travel challenges and enhanced movement across the constituency.

Tarmacked roads

The constituency also secured the upgrading of several roads to bitumen standards through collaboration with national road agencies.

Projects included:

- Wikililye – Mulango – Kangundo Road.
- Wikililye – Yumbisye – Kimbangingii Road.
- Wikililye – Katulani – Kavisuni – Wote Road.
- KAFOCA Side Road.
- CDF – SAVANI Road.

These upgrades enhanced road quality, reduced travel time and improved year-round accessibility.

Construction of King’oini Drift

Hon. Dr. Makali Mulu has constructed the **King’oini Drift** at a cost of **Kshs.10 million.**

The project replaced a difficult river crossing with a safer all-weather passage, improving connectivity during rainy seasons and ensuring uninterrupted movement for residents and vehicles.

Kitui Central residents benefit from Digital Hubs

Digital infrastructure has become one of the defining pillars of modern development. Across Kenya, digital connectivity is transforming how citizens access education, government services, entrepreneurship opportunities and information.

Recognising the importance of technology in accelerating socio-economic growth, Hon. Dr. Makali Mulu began investing in digital infrastructure for the people of

Kitui Central Constituency in 2022. He established Digital Hubs designed to provide communities with access to computers, internet-enabled services and digital learning opportunities.

Establishing the Ithiani Digital Hub

One of the flagship projects under the constituency’s digital infrastructure programme was the construction of the Ithiani Digital Hub in Kyangwithya West Ward.

The project was implemented in phases:

- Phase One – Kshs.4 million
 - Phase Two – Kshs.2,188,452
- The phased implementation enabled gradual expansion of the facility while ensuring that infrastructure development kept pace with available resources.
- The completed Digital Hub provides a dedicated space for ICT access, digital learning and technology-based community programmes.

Expanding Digital Infrastructure to Miambani

To ensure wider geographical coverage, a second Digital Hub was established in Miambani Ward.

- Like the Ithiani facility, the project was undertaken in two phases:
- Initial construction valued at Kshs.4 million
 - Additional development valued at Kshs.2,188,452

The phased approach demonstrates a commitment to

developing fully functional ICT facilities rather than one-off construction projects.

The Miambani Digital Hub expands opportunities for residents to access digital technologies closer to their communities.

Developing the Mulango Digital Hub

The digital infrastructure programme was further expanded to Mulango Ward, where Phase Two of the Mulango Digital Hub was completed at a cost of Kshs.6,288,452.

The inclusion of Mulango ensures that digital infrastructure is distributed across multiple wards, enabling broader access to ICT services within the constituency.

Together, the three Digital Hubs establish an important network of community technology centres capable of supporting education, entrepreneurship and digital service delivery.

New Computer Laboratory empowers students at St. Angela's Girls Secondary School

The integration of Information and Communication Technology (ICT) into education has become an essential component of modern learning.

Digital skills are increasingly required in higher education, employment, entrepreneurship and public service, making ICT infrastructure a strategic investment in human capital development.

As a result, Hon. Dr. Makali

Mulu's has enabled seamless digital learning by constructing facilities that prepare learners for a technology-driven economy.

Construction of a Modern Computer Laboratory

The constituency's flagship education ICT project is the construction of a **computer laboratory at St. Angela's Girls Secondary School in Kyangwithya East Ward.**

The project was completed at a cost of **Kshs.5 million.**

The investment created dedicated infrastructure capable

of supporting computer-based learning and practical ICT instruction.

Unlike ordinary classrooms, computer laboratories provide specialised environments designed to accommodate computer equipment, networking infrastructure and structured digital learning programmes.

The project therefore represents an important milestone in strengthening ICT capacity within secondary education in Kitui Central.

Learners benefit from school-based ICT facilities during formal education, while communities access broader digital services through the constituency's Digital Hubs.

The computer laboratory at St. Angela's Girls Secondary School represents a significant step towards integrating technology into education within Kitui Central constituency.

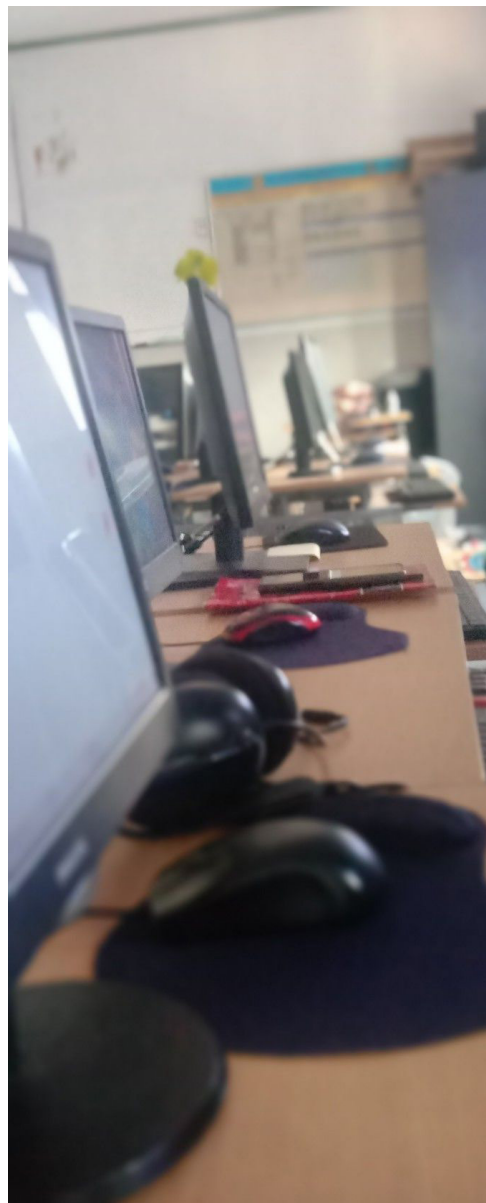
Combined with community Digital Hubs and improved electricity infrastructure, the project demonstrates a phased development strategy in which digital access becomes an integral component of constituency development.

Reliable electricity reaches more homes and institutions in Kitui Central

Access to reliable electricity is a key driver of economic growth, quality education, improved healthcare and enhanced living standards.

Since 2013, Kitui Central Constituency has experienced significant expansion of electricity infrastructure through sustained collaboration between the National Government, the Rural Electrification Authority (REA), the Rural Electrification and Renewable Energy Corporation (REREC), and Kenya Power thanks to the leadership of Hon. Dr. Makali Mulu.

Between 2013 and 2026, Hon. Makali successfully lobbied for and supported numerous electrification projects that extended power to schools, shopping centres, public institutions and rural communities. These interventions reduced

the number of households and institutions without electricity while laying the foundation for improved learning, business growth and public service delivery.

The development programme was implemented in phases, beginning with Last Mile Connectivity and Rural Electrification projects before progressing to transformer installations and expanded electricity distribution networks.

Bringing electricity closer to communities (2013 - 2022)

During the 2013 - 2022 period, one of the most significant achievements of Hon. Makali was the implementation of the Kenya Power Last Mile Connectivity Programme, which extended electricity to schools, trading centres and public institutions across Kitui Central constituency.

The programme expanded

access to electricity for both public institutions and commercial centres, supporting improved service delivery and local economic activity.

Supporting schools through electrification

Electricity has become an essential component of modern education.

The electrification programme enabled schools in Kitui Central to improve:

- Classroom lighting.
- Computer use.
- Science laboratory operations.
- Administration.
- Security.
- Evening learning programmes.

Schools connected through the programme became better positioned to integrate technology into teaching while creating safer and more conducive learning environments.

The electrification of educational institutions also complemented investments in classrooms, laboratories and digital infrastructure undertaken during the same period.

Electrifying trading centres

Several shopping centres in Kitui Central constituency benefited from electricity expansion through the Last Mile programme.

These included:

- Ithumulani Shopping Centre
- Kwa Kavwele Shopping Centre
- Kamale Shopping Centre
- Mulango Shopping Centre.
- Museve Market
- Mulundi Market
- Ngiini Market

- Ithimani Market Area.

Electricity allows businesses to operate longer hours, power equipment, preserve perishable goods and adopt modern technologies such as electronic payment systems.

The improved electricity supply has therefore strengthened commercial activity while creating a more attractive environment for investment.

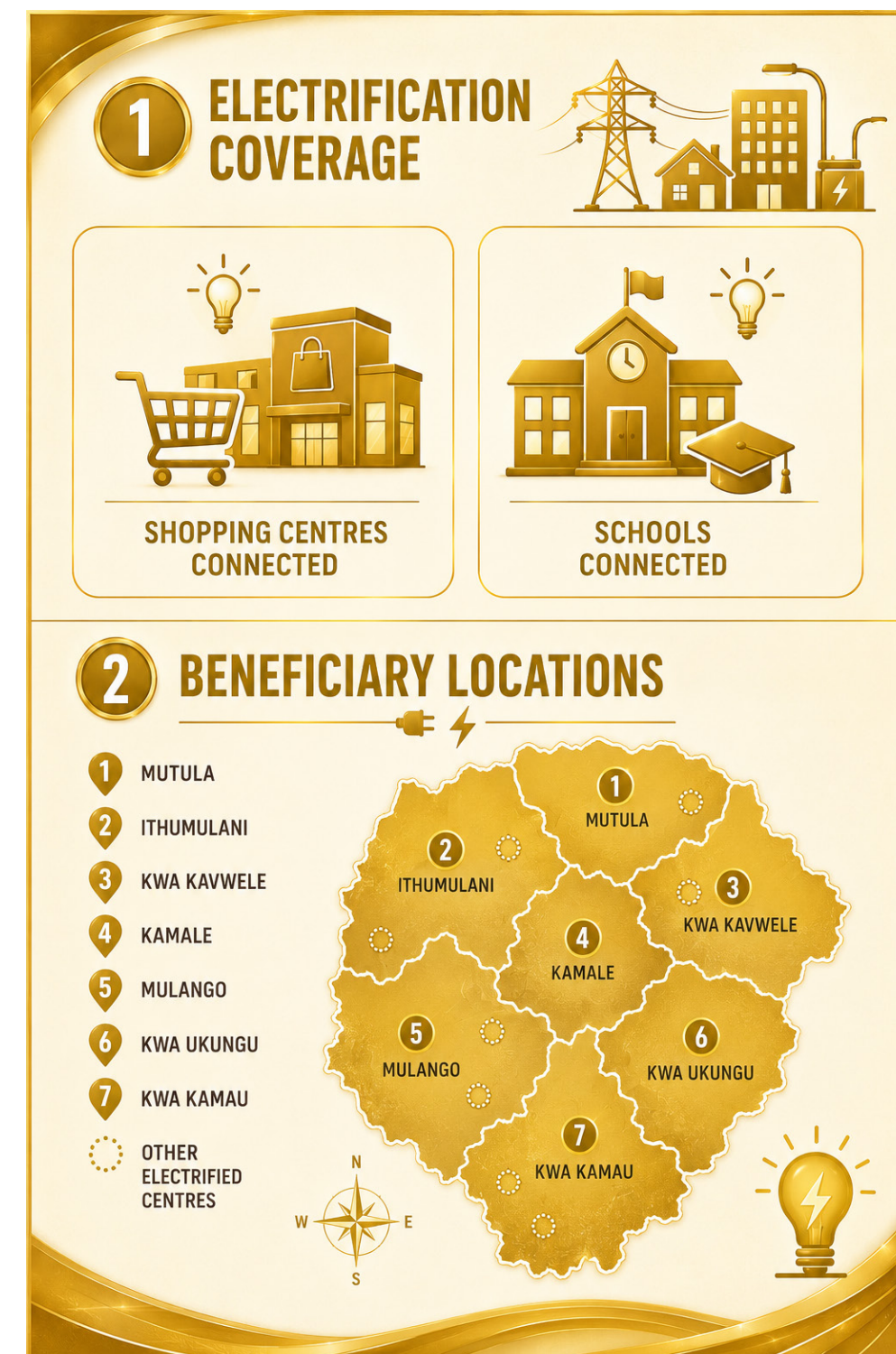
Rural Electrification Authority (REA) projects

Alongside the Kenya Power programme, Hon. Dr. Makali lobbied for additional projects were implemented through the Rural Electrification Authority (REA).

Completed projects included electrification works at:

- Kwa Masesi Shopping Centre
- Ithulumani Shopping Centre
- Mutula Shopping Centre
- Kwa Kavwele Shopping Centre
- Kamale Shopping Centre
- Kwa Ukungu Shopping Centre
- Kwa Kamau Shopping Centre.

The individual projects ranged in value from approximately



Kshs.1.31 million to Kshs.3.70 million, representing substantial investment in extending the electricity distribution network within the constituency.

Public institutions benefiting from improved electricity access included schools and government facilities that previously relied on limited or unreliable power supply.

Reliable electricity has strengthened service delivery by enabling:

These improvements complement investments in education, security and digital infrastructure across the constituency.

Transformers, power distribution infrastructure and

grid reinforcement ensure that communities receive stable, reliable and adequate electricity capable of supporting growing demand.

Between 2013 and 2026, Hon. Dr. Makali Mulu complemented Last Mile Connectivity projects with strategic investments in electricity distribution infrastructure for Kitui Central constituency.

Through successful collaboration with the Rural Electrification and Renewable Energy Corporation

(REREC) and other national agencies, Hon. Dr. Makali Mulu supported the installation of distribution transformers and expansion of electricity infrastructure to strengthen power reliability across the constituency.

Over 46,000 students receive bursaries in Kitui Central since 2013

Beyond constructing classrooms and laboratories, sustained support for learners through bursaries, scholarships and other educational assistance enables children from vulnerable households to remain in school, complete their education and pursue productive futures.

Between 2013 and 2026, Hon. Dr. Makali Mulu placed educational support at the centre of his development agenda by allocating substantial National Government Constituencies Development Fund (NG-CDF) resources to bursaries while simultaneously investing in educational infrastructure and institutional capacity.

is a partnership with the Goats Foundation to improve household livelihoods among vulnerable members of his community.

Under the programme, 200 widows received two goats each, with the initiative valued at approximately Kshs.900,000.

Although modest in comparison with large infrastructure projects, the programme represents a targeted intervention aimed at improving household resilience.

Goats are productive assets that provide opportunities for breeding, milk production and income generation.

For many rural households in Kitui Central constituency, livestock ownership contributes to food security while creating an additional source of earnings that can support education, healthcare and other family needs.

Rather than providing one-time consumption support, the programme focused on productive empowerment capable of generating long-term socio-economic benefits for beneficiaries.

Parliamentary representation beyond the constituency

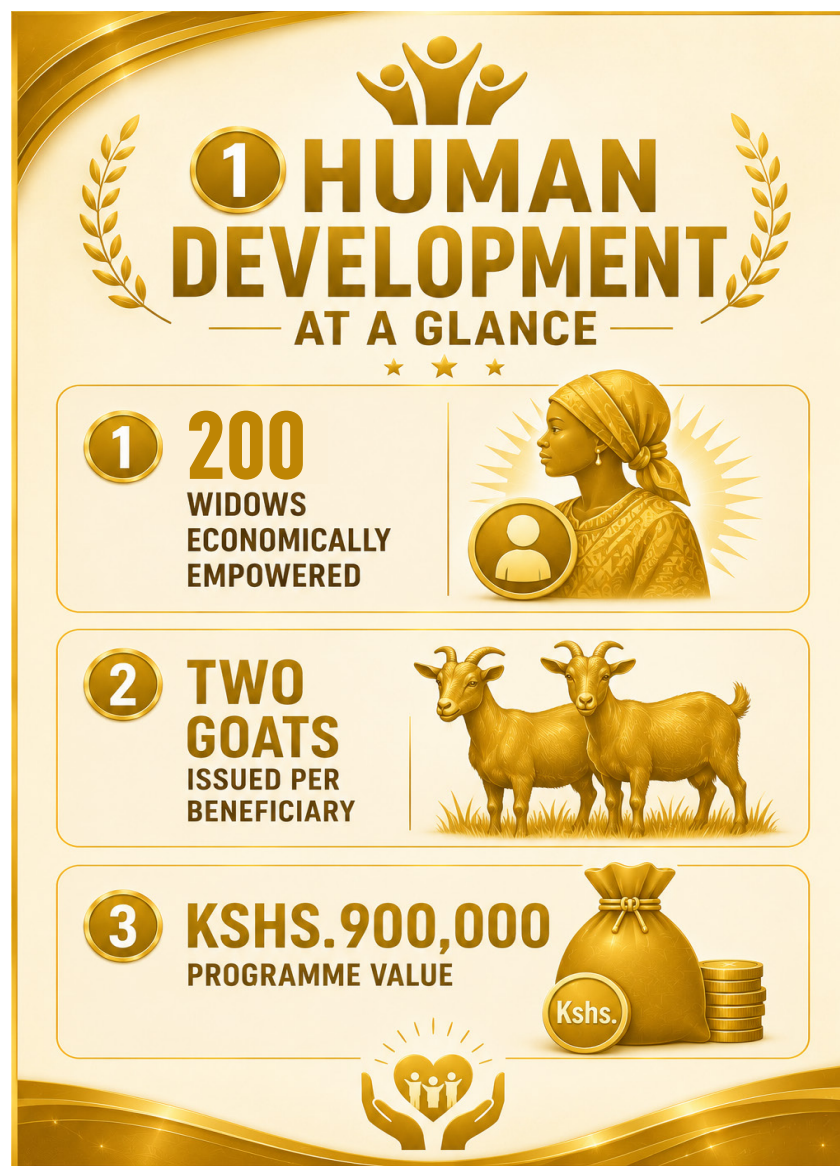
In addition to constituency development, Hon. Dr. Makali Mulu has played an active role in Parliament through committee work, legislative debate and oversight of public finances.

constitutional responsibility of Members of Parliament to legislate, oversee public expenditure and represent citizens within the National Assembly.

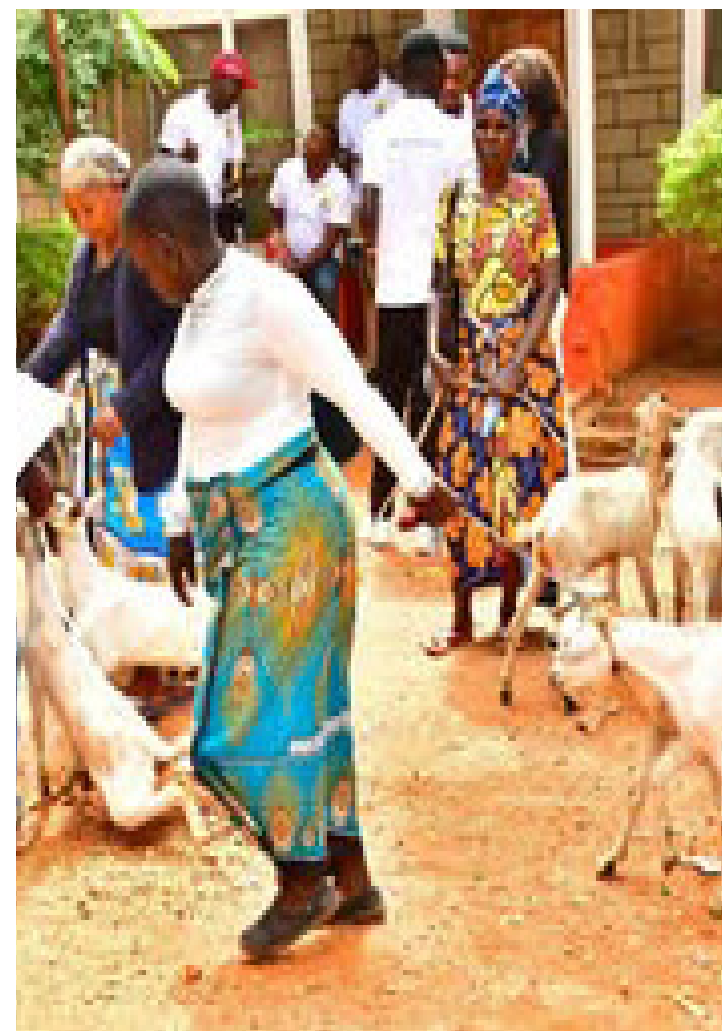
Oversight as a development tool

Employment remains one of the most important indicators of sustainable development. While some programmes create jobs directly through recruitment, others generate employment by financing infrastructure projects, supporting local contractors, engaging skilled

and unskilled labour, and investing in education that prepares citizens for future careers. Hon. Dr. Makali Mulu has contributed to employment creation in Kitui Central Constituency through extensive public infrastructure investments, expansion of educational institutions, digital infrastructure development and successful lobbying for national government projects.

These initiatives generated thousands of work opportunities during construction while laying the foundation for long-term employment by improving access to education, digital skills and public services. **Infrastructure Development as a source of employment** The constituency’s largest employment contribution arose from the extensive public

infrastructure programme implemented between 2013 and 2027. Construction of classrooms, laboratories, dormitories, kitchens, dining halls, toilet blocks, Digital Hubs, administrative offices, police housing and other public facilities required contractors, engineers, masons, carpenters, electricians, plumbers, welders, painters, transport providers and suppliers. Each completed project created temporary employment opportunities during implementation while strengthening local businesses that supplied construction materials and services. The scale of educational infrastructure alone - including hundreds of classroom renovations, dozens of new classrooms and multiple science laboratories - represented sustained investment

in labour-intensive public works over more than a decade.

Road construction supporting labour-intensive employment

Road improvement projects also created significant employment opportunities.

The constituency successfully mobilised hundreds of millions of shillings for grading, slab construction, drainage

improvements and tarmacking of strategic roads across Kitui Central.
